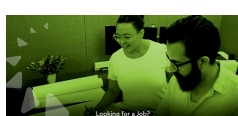

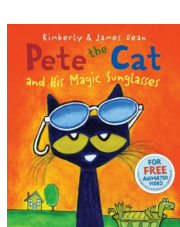


### Resources and Tips for Tax Deadline

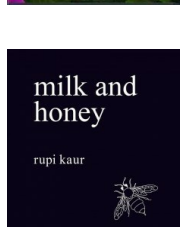
