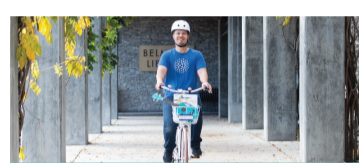

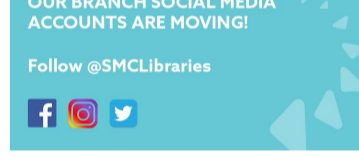

Explore eLearning at The Tech Café

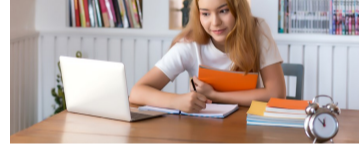

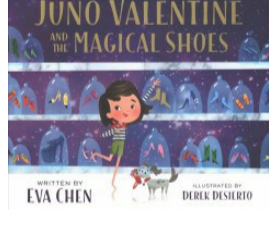
Practice for the SAT Exam Virtually

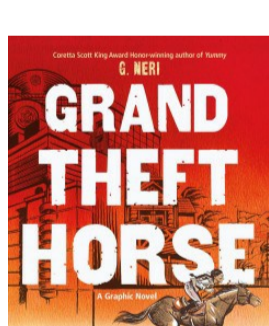

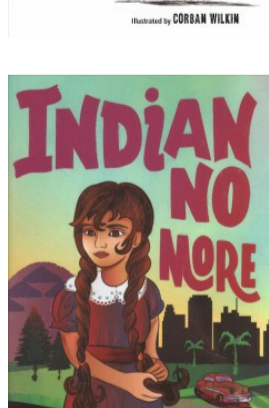
