Hotspots - PCPL is in the process of purchasing 400 hotspots to use with local students. Conversations are in progress Pima County School Superintendent's office about hotspots. We continue to talk with local district superintendents about their needs and are encouraging them to sign up for the SORA app, which allows local schools with access to our OverDrive ebook platform. Sunnyside was the first district. Ajo districts 15 and 103, Tucson Country Day School, and Continental School District 39 have since signed up to connect with PCPL.
