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“My granddaughter is on the frontline in Windsor and she was telling us that on Saturday a whole team went to a nursing home to test the residents. She said that all of the people in the nursing home were so cooperative and she said it was a really big project. She said that the doctors and the nurses all go to make sure that everybody is being looked after, as well as can be expected... She sent me a picture of her gown and she had on the face shield and she had put some happy little stickers on one side of the shield and wrote her name on the other side... The pandemic has affected my life differently than it would've normally. I had not been out of my house, except on the veranda. Normally, I would go for my mail and I would house sit for the lady down the street. Also, I would go shopping. It limited my life down to this bungalow that I own and my cat. But, there is an upside. My two kids share their time with me... They do the shopping, the meals and everything. My life is absolutely and completely different. To me, it all happened at once. I burnt myself severely when the pandemic started and it all seemed to hit at once. I was concerned and grounded for two reasons... There's been an upside to it because I have my kids here. And being waited on is absolutely marvelous. [laughing] With a lot of help from a lot of people, I am alright.”
