

- Foster early literacy skills in children who visit their incarcerated parents in Santa Rita and Glenn Dyer jails (Start with a Story).

- Support new Americans, immigrants, and refugees by offering citizenship workshops, English language programs, and Know Your Rights trainings.

- Embrace inclusive learning with multi-cultural diversity in children's picture books, storytimes in more than three languages, and sensory play days for children with special needs.
- Nourish healthy bodies with a variety of food programs for children and families during the summer and year-round.
- Encourage healthy brain and physical motor skills development by providing large-scale interactive play spaces for children.

Prepare communities for disasters with emergency preparedness workshops.

Provide families with free and discounted passes to museums and cultural venues. Give out free N95 Masks to protect against smoke from California Wildfires.

Promote bicycle safety and safe driving by offering free safety classes.

Offer Mental Health First Aid training to Library staff.








Serve as Warming/Cooling Centers for families and seniors.
